Following is list of current topics and speakers - final schedule to be determined

**John Rapping - Being the 21<sup>st</sup> Century Defender: Professionalism in Communication.** John is director of the Southern Public Defender Training Center in Atlanta, Georgia. He is the former training director for the Georgia State Defender, and worked as a Public Defender in Washington, D.C.

**G Paul Marx - 2011 Recent Cases and Statutes in Criminal Justice** G Paul is the District Defender in the 15<sup>th</sup> Judicial District of Louisiana, and is the former Executive Counsel of the La Public Defenders Association, a former attorney with the Louisiana Appellate Project, and a 30 year veteran of public defender advocacy in state and federal courts.

**Leslie Schiff - Ethics in Client Communication** Leslie Schiff is a former LSBA President and works in the Disciplinary system as an attorney for attorneys. This ethics hour will be directly applicable to the public defender function.

**Bob Noel - Soap or no Soap?** What is the status of the Sex Offender Assessment Panels that would impose lifetime sex offender registration upon discharged inmates decreed "Sexual Predators". Bob Noel is a felony supervisor, veteran public defender and incoming president of LACDL.

**Jay Dixon - Trial Diplomacy: Dealing with your judges** Jay is District Defender in Calcasieu Parish and has a rich and varied resume involving Criminal Justice. One of his major achievements has been to engage the Public Defender as a participant in planning and execution of policy. So here are some hints on dealing with your judges.

**Tony Champagne - State Board Progress and Developments** Tony is District Defender in Terrebonne Parish and has attended most recent meetings of the La. Public Defender Board. An update on what the policy and planning is from the state level.

**Bill Goode & Samuel Ward - Traffic Stop Boilerplate: Is this a script?** Bill Goode has an idea that traffic drug stops are being scripted in terms of testimony. And he can prove it! Bill is a Criminal Defense Attorney with federal and state experience, and he and his videographer will show the remarkable congruence of several stops in Lafayette Parish.

**King Alexander - Sex Offender Registration A to Z** King is Chair of the LACDL Amicus Committee and a Public Defender in Calcasieu Parish. We hope to have a panel on this topic and a good overview of the obligations and details for sex offender registration, AND a view from the client on the hardships it causes.

**John Rapping** is the Director of the Southern Public Defender Training Center in Atlanta Georgia. The intensive training program every summer in Birmingham, Alabama combines trial advocacy and an understanding of the importance of public defenders to provide an exceptional skill set for new public defenders. The project continues training with annual reunions for years, information sharing through communication structures for building a defender community. John brings a sample of this training for our Professionalism program this year.

## **JUVENILE TRACK**

A combination of plenary and special track presenters in cooperation with the Juvenile Defenders of East Baton Rouge and the 15<sup>th</sup> Judicial District, this practical update brings both an overview and particular issues to the table. Half a day Friday and a 9 to 5 schedule Saturday cover all the required CLE hours for juvenile defenders.

**G Paul Marx - Introduction: Ten Things I Hate About Juvenile Courts - Ethics** What is it that a public defender should be doing as a professional in Juvenile Court? Is this court one in which the client is simply to be informed of her fate, or does the law today mandate that we be lawyers?

**Juvenile Justice Panel on How Standards Help You - Janet Brown (Juvenile Team Leader in the 15<sup>th</sup> Judicial District); Annette Roach (Intermediate Appellate Counsel in the 15<sup>th</sup>)** How can the standards now a part of regulatory law help attorneys deal with resistance from the bench and state on proper procedures and representation for kids in court?

### **Saturday- Juvenile Track**

**Annette Roach (Intermediate Appellate Counsel in the 15<sup>th</sup>)** Using the Writ: how to bring rulings short of appealable judgments to the Court of Appeal and Supreme Court. Termination of Parental Rights, violations of Due Process; excessive sentencing's all can be subject to review if you know what to do.

**Tracy Davenport McGraw (Juvenile Team Leader, 15<sup>th</sup> Judicial District)** Getting a plan for CINC including attending status conferences with DCFS and following the progress to stay informed and engaged for your clients.

**Sean Collins (East Baton Rouge PDO) - Post Transfer Representation** - How to help kids after transfer and what the representation must include that directly relates to Juvenile Justice.

### **Saturday Plenary**

**JJPL Team - What Reform Really Means Now** - How the conduct of Juvenile Justice has been changed and what it means for counsel and the kids in the Juvenile System.

**Mental Health Issues (Brittany Yoes) / LGBT; Wesley Ware (East Baton Rouge PD)** - Using Mental Health as an issue that helps kids through the system. Important concepts for addressing and defending kids. The Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual and Transgender project of the ACLU and in juvenile justice reflects on how we should take care to defend lifestyles that the system might attempt to persecute. How can juvenile defenders reach an understanding of and a strategy to assist kids in court in these particular circumstances?
